<b>Length</b>	Please check module description
<b>Approach</b> (literary or cultural studies)	Concept / Text / Theory
<b>Sources:</b>	Relevant, up-to-date, classics (if applicable) Not all papers have a theoretical or historical outlook, but if they do, you need to use appropriate sources) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <b>Historical background</b></li> <li>- <b>Concept / theory / method</b></li> <li>- <b>Secondary sources</b></li> </ul>
<b>Use of sources</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Understanding the argument</li> <li>✓ Engaging productively with argument</li> <li>✓ Quoting passages relevant for own argument</li> </ul>
<b>Structure of paper</b>	Table of contents, introduction, theoretical / methodological chapter, analysis chapter/s, conclusions
<b>Cohesion</b>	Correspondence introduction – conclusion; use of concept / theory / method in analysis chapter/s
<b>Thesis statement</b>	Formulated in “Introduction”, demonstrated in paper
➤ <b>Research question/s</b>	One or several clearly formulated research question/s (in the “Introduction” to the paper)
<b>Argumentation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Thesis-oriented, argument-based</li> <li>✓ Engages with and responds to other interpretations of primary text (secondary literature)</li> </ul>
<b>Text analysis</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Relevant text passages (primary text)</li> <li>✓ Command of analysis techniques</li> <li>✓ Linked directly to thesis statement and argument-oriented</li> </ul>
<b>Editing</b>	Form (errors, mistakes) Content (inconsistencies, omissions, contradictions) Style (academic, written, standard)
<b>Individuality / Originality</b>	New arguments, new readings, original links / associations Particular strength/s (can compensate for particular weakness/es)
<b>Style</b>	Academic standard of English, academic vocabulary
<b>Quotation style</b>	MLA standard (in-text and bibliography)
