Kommentar:

Medicine is among the sciences that has always been the subject of contextual debates. The importance of the medical science during different historical periods in Persianate world was reflected in various religious, philosophical, and historical discourses. Therefore, basically, finding the place of medicine in scientific and religious debates during different periods of the history of Persianate world is the core idea of this course. The medicine and religion in history and text in addition focuses on the following subject areas:

- Medicine in the history of Persianate world
- Medicine in religious texts
- Medicine between science and religion
- Magics as therapies, demons as causes of diseases

In this seminar, these four subject areas are discussed based on the primary and secondary sources. The cultural, social and, to some extent, the political functions of these areas are also focused on in the course of history.

Kommentar:

In a research project, we develop our own methodology based on the questions we raise and the material we intend to observe. However, some theories and concepts are deeply woven into the academic language, shaping our understanding of objective and subjective phenomena. For instance, in the early twentieth century, new linguistic theory made a significant impact not just on how we studied language, but also on how we perceived other disciplines such as history, ethnology, and art.

This course focuses on some crucial theories which can offer a framework and method for research works. It delves into semiotics, structuralism, iconography, intertextuality as well as orientalism approaches. The course will cover the uses of these methods in investigations where pictures play an important part in establishing argument. Following the last course on early photography in the Islamic world (Winter Semester 2023), the primary focus of this course will be on, but not limited to, photography as a documental tool in historical, art historical, social, and political studies. During the sessions, we track our discussions about theories by reading and analyzing related essays that use one of the aforementioned theories as a framework. In its next part, in a group work we examine some selected pictures (regarding students' background these pictures can be selected from different pictorial archives and geographical regions) and discuss a proper methodology that corresponds to a research theory in order to practice thinking and selecting a proper methodology for a research project.

The course will be in English; Participants do not need special pre-knowledge; however, the content of the course is more proper for master students.

This course will focus on women and their everyday actions in Iran and other Muslim-majority countries of the Near and Middle East and North Africa. We will ask how women are able to reformulate their roles and identities in patriarchal systems and public discourses through their actions. Important questions are how significant are the consolidation or questioning of ideas of "tradition" and "modernity" and the mediation of new meanings. In this context we will discuss central texts of feminist and social theories, and anthropological studies of Muslim societies as well.

Kommentar:

The notion of Iran as “Land of the Aryans” has led to a number of misunderstandings and misconceptions, in particular about a particular inclination of the Iranian government and public towards Nazism during the 1930s, which was allegedly based on a shared “Aryan” heritage.

This course will take a critical view at such perceptions by examining the origins and formations of the Aryan discourse in the history of ideas in Europe since the 1800s. On the basis of a critical reading of sources, and by identifying the major protagonists, the emergence of the term “Aryanism” and its development (and misinterpretation) into a key concept of modern racism will be examined. The main focus will be on the question which status was assigned to Iran and its inhabitants as an origin of “Aryan” peoples by propagandists of the Aryan ideology. Finally, the course will discuss the question how these theories were perceived and discussed in Iran itself.

Kommentar:

Middle Persian has developed from Old Persian and was spoken in the first millennium CE. It is attested by inscriptions, Zoroastrian and Manichaeian texts. It was the common language during the Sasanian Empire and the liturgical language of the Zoroastrians in Iran as well as of the Manichaeans in Central Asia. We will learn Middle Persian grammar, the different scripts and read texts from different periods of

the Middle Persian language. Students will be made familiar with grammars, dictionaries, and online data base projects.

Kommentar:

This course explores the intricate connections between Persian cinema, language, and society, examining how films reflect and influence linguistic and cultural evolution in Iran. Through the analysis of key works in Persian cinema, students will gain insights into the sociopolitical contexts, cultural narratives, and linguistic shifts that shape contemporary Iranian society.

Key topics include:

Historical Context: Understanding the evolution of Persian cinema from its inception to the present day.

Cultural Representation: Analyzing how films portray Iranian culture, traditions, and societal changes.

Language and Dialogue: Investigating the use of language in films and its role in reflecting and shaping societal norms and values.

Linguistic Evolution: Exploring how cinematic language influences and is influenced by the evolving Persian language.

Social Issues: Discussing themes such as gender, politics, and identity as depicted in Persian films.

By the end of the course, students will have a comprehensive understanding of the dynamic interplay between Persian cinema, language, and society, and how each informs and transforms the other.

Titel: **The Kalila wa Dimna Tradition in Translation**

Kommentar:

This course will introduce the reception and the development of the Kalila wa Dimna series of animal fables as an Indian narrative literature in Persian literature. We will study framing narrative structures, dominant themes, and their linguistic features in Persian renderings and rewritings of stories of Indian origin (Sanskrit or vernacular), accomplished in India or outside of South Asian borders from the medieval to colonial periods, taking into account primary and secondary sources in Persian and English languages about the history of Persian literature. For our case study, we will focus on the different retellings of the Kalila wa Dimna tales, which served as court literature in the mirror for princes' genre, as well as popular literature for the masses. Besides, students will practice narratological theories and comparative methods for the classification and literary analysis of narratives and their cultural adaptations in the Persianate context.

Students can expect to learn the following through successful completion of this course:

- The origins and relations of Indian and Iranian mythology in Persian and Sanskrit epic texts.
- An integral vision of the formation of the Persianate culture in India beginning with the invasion of Ghaznavids to the advent of Delhi Sultanates and the Mughals.
- Persian and Islamic Intertextual narrative corpus: adoption, evolution and exchange of literary styles, forms and content.
- The translation and transmission of Indian narratives into Persian literary corpus
- The influence of Persian literary tradition on Indian literature.
- Different versions of Kalila fables: the Pahlavi hypotext, Rudaki's Persian Kalila, Bal'ami's Kalila, Nasr Allah Munshi's Tarjuma-yi Kalila wa Dimna, Qani'i Tusi's versification, Va'iz Kashifi's Anwar-i Suhaili, Abu al-Fazl 'Allami's 'Ayar-i Danish, Nigar-i Danish, Nineteenth and twentieth century versions.
- English translations of the Persian Kalila wa Dimna

- Indo-Persian Culture through narrative literature.
